Primary School PE and Sport Premium 2018 - 2019

Church Aston Infant School **£16,370**

The Physical Education and Sports Grant for the financial year 2017/2018 is approx. **£16,000 plus £10 for each Year 1 and Year 2 pupil** based on January Census 2017. This amounts to **£16,370**. The conditions of the grant are not due to be released until October 2017. The under spend will allow for the additional money to be spent as required by the conditions of the grant.

After School Clubs x 4 per week Clubs are offered at a cost of £2 a session and run by a Sports Coach from Double Touch Coaching.	£4,125	A range of sporting clubs were available to all children to provide them with opportunity to try out different sports including tennis, football and multi skills delivered by qualified coaches. A consistent number of children accessed these clubs throughout the year. A Change for Life club was also provided and increased children's awareness of healthy lifestyle. Children are able to express confidently things to do to help stay healthy including healthy eating choices, different types of exercise and the need for healthy routines e.g. sleep.
Continue to hire local Village Hall to provide increased indoor space for PE activities and to enable storage of a range of PE equipment. This enables PE to place regardless of weather conditions.	£1,000	Children have access to a wide range of PE sessions on a regular basis (two per week) Facilities enable staff to plan and deliver dance, gymnastics and curling sessions effectively.
Sport coaching at lunchtimes to deliver active play activities.	£0	To be developed further in 2019-20 with the introduction of Playground Leaders

Telford and Wrekin School Sport Partnership (TWSSP)	£462	<p>The sports partnership has also provided training for staff to ensure they are confident to deliver a range of Physical Education Lessons for example gym sessions.</p> <p>Being part of the Telford and Wrekin Sport partnership enables groups of children throughout the school to have the opportunity to participate in sporting activities and enter competitions with/against children from other schools. Being a small school this means that children can be challenged through competition and awareness of other children's achievements. The Sports Premium has been used to fund the travel costs to these events which often take place in centres of excellence and encourage the children to continue with particular sports.</p> <p>Staff training provided to review skills and PE coverage with PE specialist.</p>
<p>Cool Kids – a Teaching Assistant runs a program of activities to develop fine and gross motor skills. This is attended by any Pupil Premium child who is in need of this area of development</p> <p>1 Teaching Assistant for 1.5 hours per week</p>	£652	This supported the development of fine motor skills within the class setting.
<p>Scooting Stars</p> <p>The course teaches children basic scooter handling and control skills through a variety of games and exercises.</p>	£0	<p>Scooting, cycling and walking to school is promoted for healthy living and active lives.</p>
<p>Cycle Skills</p> <p>The course teaches children basic bike handling and control skills.</p>	£185	<p>The school took part in the national competition, The Big Pedal, which encouraged more children to scoot and cycle to school. Children now scoot and cycle on a regular basis. To encourage early cycling skills for our EYFS children a balance bike was purchased to support our existing bike and scooter provision to further develop balance and gross motor skills.</p>
Pedestrian Training	£0	All children benefited from sessions planned around how to keep safe when out walking in a built up area, there was no charge for this.

Swimming - Spring Term (10 sessions) Swimming Instructor and Additional Staff Transport	£400 £1,000	Swimming is not part of the Key Stage 1 curriculum but we believe that children should be encouraged to swim from an early age. Each year the Sports Premium has been used to fund the travel and swimming coach to enable every child in school to participate in 5 sessions of swimming. All children showed progress in their water confidence and swimming ability. Many children have continued to follow with a course of swimming lessons.
Transport to local sporting events (approx. 5 events)	£100	In relation to the Telford and Wrekin Sport partnership the Sports Premium has been used to fund the travel costs to these events which often take place in centres of excellence and encourage the children to continue with particular sports.
Resources and replacement equipment including large scale climbing equipment.	£6300	To encourage children to understand the principles of team sport and competition, and for children to be keen to represent their team, the school purchased team sashes, stickers and trophies to use as part of the annual Sports Day. This raised children's understanding of competition, the principles of team work, team success and team spirit. Funding towards the replacement of worn playground surface with new astroturf suitable for sporting activity. Purchase play tower to allow for a variety of gross motor movement including a variety of climbing activities and a range of movements.
A PE Hub subscription	£180	Used to engage children in positive in fun, physical activities including ones that they could continue to use independently in other sessions during the week.
