We are taking part in the RSPB Schools birdwatch this year. We have already seen two pheasants!




Class 2 have continued the explorers theme by looking at the story book Quest. This text is illustrated by Aaron Becker and has no words so Class 2 have become the story tellers. So far they have made predictions about where the map will lead the children and what is behind the door. The children have thought about character feelings and used adjectives to describe these. They have role played the events so far to help them write their opening. In maths they have started looking at groups and how they can be equal and unequal and they have used bar models to show repeated equal groups. In year 1 the children are looking at numbers 20-100 and identifying the value of the tens and units digits. The children are working so hard in their swimming sessions and have forms for our sponsored swim on the 12th February so please check their bags.

### Council to take over parking enforcement on 31 January

We have been asked to share the following information with you.

Powers to enforce illegal on street parking in the borough will transfer from West Mercia Police to Telford & Wrekin Council at the end of the month (31 January). From that date, the Council's team of Neighbourhood Enforcement Officers will be able to issue Penalty Charge Notices for parking contraventions.

Parents and staff may have already seen the officers on patrol and issuing warning notices.

The officers' roles will extend way beyond the issuing of "parking tickets"; they will also be able to deal with environmental crime such as dog-fouling, littering and fly-tipping.
