
Here's Debbie.

In school we have been making beautiful rainbows to brighten up our day.



If you are able to get out for a little exercise to go on a safe walk around the village of Church Aston, we would love to see your pictures when you find them.


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# HOME AND SCHOOL LEARNING

## PIECES OF EIGHT

Pirates need plenty of food to make them strong. Try these delicious scones and you will feel big and strong.

**You will need:**

- 225g (8oz) self-raising flour
- 25g (1oz) castor sugar
- 50g (2oz) margarine
- 50g (2oz) dried fruit
- Milk to mix


**What to do:**

- Sieve the flour into a bowl.
- Rub in the margarine until the mixture looks like fine breadcrumbs. Add sugar and dried fruit.
- Mix to a firm dough with a little milk. Add this carefully, a spoonful at a time.
- Roll out and cut your shapes.
- Place on a baking tray and cook in a hot oven (Reg. 6/400°F/ 200°C) for 10 minutes.
- The scones are cooked when they feel quite firm if they are pressed on the side.

When cold cut the scones in half and spread with butter or margarine. Put them together and arrange on a plate.







## TREASURE CHESTS

Pirates used to steal money and valuables which they kept in a strong box with a lid. This Treasure Chest was often buried in a secret place but if you were lucky enough to discover it you might find it to be full of gold pieces or precious jewels.

Now make some Treasure Chests for your tea party.

**You will need:**

- 100g (4oz) margarine
- 100g (4oz) castor sugar
- 2 eggs
- 175g (6oz) self-raising flour
- 25g (1oz) cocoa

**What to do:**

- Cream together the margarine and the sugar.
- Beat the eggs.
- Add the flour and cocoa and mix well.
- Put into a greased, oblong tin.
- Bake in a hot oven (Reg. 7/ 425°F/220°C) for 15 minutes.
- When the cake is cool cut it into oblong shapes.


**Icing**


**You will need:**

- 100g (4oz) icing sugar
- 25g (1oz) cocoa
- Water to mix
- Smarties to decorate

**What to do:**

- Put the sugar and cocoa into a basin.
- Add the water, a little drop at a time, until the icing is soft.
- Cover your chest and lid with icing.
- Arrange your Smarties to look like treasure and then put the lid on your chest.
