Another good week for the children both in school and at home. I was in school earlier in the week, it was lovely to catch up with parents and to see the children. The sound of children laughing and playing is a very precious sound so that was particularly wonderful to hear.

With your support I am hoping to organise some transition time and an opportunity for our Year 2 children to spend two days in school. We are extremely limited and it would need the cooperation of our Year 1 and Reception parents but what I plan to do is to close for the school year for Reception and Year 1 children on Wednesday 15th July and then invite our Year 2 children in on Thursday 16th July and Friday 17th July. As a staff we would really like to give this opportunity to our Year 2 children and help prepare them for their next move. If anyone has any difficulties with this and would like to discuss it further with me then please contact me in the usual way.

We would be following the same current safety guidance so we would use both classrooms if necessary and children would have their own individual space. I am arranging for the Year 3 teachers from Moorfield to come over to visit so that they can meet the children and talk about Year 3 to them. If your child isn't moving on to Moorfield I have spoken to the corresponding heads and they will be in touch to discuss transition with you individually. Mrs Powell will be talking to all Year 3 teachers regardless of which school your child is moving to as part of our normal transition work.

So with this in mind I am asking Year 2 parents to fill out the questionnaire to indicate if their child would return to school for the two days. Please return the questionnaire by Midday Tuesday 23rd June in order for us to make appropriate arrangements. Please click here to complete the questionnaire.

MATHLETICS DATA

With so many children this week doing amazingly well with Mathletics it got me thinking about how well you have done with Mathletics this year. As a school so far there has been 1161 logins, over 690,000 points and over 650 hours of work with some children having achieved over 51 hours of learning time on Mathletics and over 51 thousand points. We as a school have so far given out 380 Bronze, 69 Silver and 13 Gold certificates for achievement in Mathletics this academic year. This is simply amazing! Keep going everyone as we soon will



be able to announce who are our top Year R, 1 and Yr 2 Mathletics Superstars of the Year.

Remember for every **1000 points** earned in a week you achieve a **bronze certificate**.

For <u>Silver</u> is it achieved <u>after 5 bronze</u> certificates and <u>Gold</u> is after you have achieved <u>4</u> silver certificates (20 weeks of sustained effort).

Have a lovely weekend. Hopefully no more rain!




How are you getting on with your 'Weird and Wonderful' animal research? It's been wonderful seeing all the interesting facts you have found out.



We got to hold Mrs Sanders butterfly that she is caring for after it didn't manage to fly when she tried to release it. We also had fun at playtime.




























HOME LEARNING CONTINUED


