HEAD TEACHER'S HIGHLIGHTS


Well Christmas has certainly begun. The children and staff so enjoyed Christmas lunch as well as the special visit from Santa and his Elf.

She spent time discussing what we had been doing in school recently with regards to our curriculum. She felt it was broad and balanced and she was keen to hear about developments that we are working on such as Maths Mastery. Michelle also spent time talking to children about their experiences at Church Aston and looking at their books. I am pleased to say she saw a great deal of progress, super strategies used in maths and excellent writing. She was keen to congratulate school on their results both at the end of EYFS and KS1 and of course in Phonics.

We're on our countdown to the end of term and the children have worked so hard, I am so proud of them all! This week we have been checking our letter formation to ensure everyone is able to join when they are ready. The children checked they were sitting on their chair correctly, holding their pencil with the correct grip and the other hand holding their book. We particularly focused on ascenders and descenders (f g j p q y) to check they were written on the line correctly and ascenders (b d f h k I t) are taller than the other letters. We finished our Peter and the Wolf work, writing instructions for making a theatre using command sentences with imperative verbs. In maths we have continued looking at patterns and adding by partitioning the single digit 38+3 38+2=40

40+1=41. The performance of Whoops A Daisy was amazing, well done!



#### **AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS—SPRING TERM**

When we return to school in January it will be the start of the Spring Term and new booking forms and payment will be needed for all after school clubs.

We would like to thank everyone who gave us feedback about our after school club provision at parents evening. Following this we have discussed alternative clubs with our Coaching provider. Lego was a popular choice so we will be introducing this on a Tuesday. We are also now able to offer new options on other nights so will be introducing Basketball and Unihoc jointly on a Friday night to see which the children enjoy most. Please be assured that the very popular Football and Art Clubs will continue. We will review this again for the Summer term to provide some variety through the year.

Following our recent change to our new coaching company we have also needed to review the costs related to our after school club provision to ensure that they are cost effective and that we are able to maintain this facility for you as parents and carers and that it remains cheaper than/competitive in relation to other local provisions. As a result of this review our after school club costs will be as follows starting in the Spring term:

3pm to 4pm After School Clubs—£3.00 per session.

4 O'clock Club—£4.00 per session.

There will be no change to Breakfast Club charges.

We hope lots of children come to try the new clubs, registration forms are attached to this email, please complete one for any club you would like your child to attend next term and return it, with payment, to one of the class letterboxes. Thank you.
