
RECEPTION children—letters sent home on 24 September

NCMP—Following the letter sent home to you this week regarding the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP) please find attached an electronic copy of the leaflet. As stated in the letter, please remember that if you **do not** want your child to take part you need to contact the School Nurse service, using the details given in the letter, by no later than **Friday 12**th **October 2018**.

Vision Screening—We also sent a letter home relating to vision screening which is due to take place in school for Reception children on 9 October. Should you wish to have your child **excluded** from the eye test you will need to complete the form that was enclosed with the letter and send it back to school **within 7 days**.

ROAD CLOSURE

We have been informed about a road closure that is very close to school and may affect your journeys to and from school. A temporary road closure will be in place along **Wellington Road to Greenvale, Church Aston** from **Monday 1st October 2018** and will last for a **duration of 5 days** with an end date of **Friday 5th October 2018**, however this end date may change. The planned diversion is shown on this map.

- Applying for infant to junior school places to start in September 2019 (current Year 2 pupils) closing date 15 January 2019
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2018 for all applications.
