We have been busy getting into our work this week. There has been a great buzz around the school with phonics, reading , writing and maths going on. Please ensure your child has opportunity to read

their school reading books at home. Your support for reading is invaluable. Also, you will see that weekly spellings will start from next week for Year 1 and 2. It really helps with the flow of writing when children are confident spelling the majority of common words.

The children have been given their Mathletics passwords, they are in the front of their reading diaries. So we shall be rewarding children with certificates from next week. Please remember the points are collected from Friday to Thursday, so in order to have a certificate for next week they will have to reach a 1000 points by Thursday evening. Good luck everyone.

An elephant hawkmoth caterpillar came into our playground. The years 1's wrote some facts about it. We kept the caterpillar in a net so that we could observe it. We found some fuchsia leaves and willow herb leaves for it. The children enjoyed seeing it released it back to where we found it. We shared caterpillar stories to learn the life cycles of butterflies and moths.

In science year 1 have been thinking about why we need to eat and drink.

Year 1 have been looking at parts and the whole in their maths. Reception have been matching and sorting objects in different ways.

Well done Class 2, another wonderful week! Everyone is enjoying sharing the interesting information about themselves as babies, thank you to everyone who helped answer our questions. In maths Year 1 we have concentrated on the language more, less, greater than, less than and looked at parts of a whole. In year 2 we have focused on using our number bonds to add three addends without counting on so, if I have the calculation 5+3+2= I know 3+2=5 so I can quickly total 5+5=. In science year 1 have been thinking about why we need to eat and drink and year 2 have learned about the different needs of baby animals and compared them to human babies. In English we are learning about our new book character Auggie, in We're all wonders. We have also looked at paintings done by Pablo Picasso and used these to inspire our own work. We have used two portraits, cut them into four pieces and then put them back together mixed up.

Reminder – please remember to bring your water bottle and reading book and Reading Record everyday. If you have a pencil case with crayons you can use and leave in school that would be great.


We have started to add content to the class pages so please take a look at photos of your children participating in school activities. Class pages are easily accessed via the home page tabs.

Children in Class 1 enjoyed seeing the Hawkmoth. They sorted and matched objects in Maths and enjoyed making the most of our outdoor learning area.






















CLASS 2
