We have lots of interesting things going on in this term. Please look out for the details of Friends of School Grow a Sunflower Competition. This is a great way to get children

and adults involved in gardening and we cannot wait to see the results at the end of term.

It has been rather a creative week with Art club producing some beautiful paintings. The children were looking closely at a range of blossom and using their paints to produce some very detailed pieces. Lego club has also provided children with the opportunity to build a range of interesting models. The children are so keen to explain what their model is and how they built it with lots of details in their explanations. Also, on Thursday I could hear some delightful small group singing and instrument playing coming from Class 2 and I later caught up with some cheerful videos of the children demonstrating their musical ability. Class 1 also had a fun music session playing a range of percussion instruments that reflected the sounds of Africa.

We have also had our student teacher Miss Amy Wiggin who is doing her final practice with us.

The children in Reception were thinking about shapes and how they are similar and different from each other. They did some great shape work with lots of discussion about the number of sides, corners and where they see these shapes in their everyday world. Please encourage your child to spot different shapes when out and about.

Year 1 have been exploring doubles and are quick to say a range of doubles. They also got to think about near doubles which is quite a useful strategy when adding and subtracting.

We have started our Africa topic and enjoyed the story of Handa's Surprise which is set in Africa. Thank you to Miss Wiggin who organised a fruit tasting session for the children. They tried a whole range of fruits including mango, avocado and passion fruit. Interestingly the fruit juice of the Guava was a big favourite.

This week Class 2 have been retelling the story of Lila and the Secret of Rain both verbally and written. As a class we have discussed Lila's feelings and thoughts and used a story map to help us sequence the events. In geography we have recapped the names of the seven continents of the world and where they are on a world map. It has been wonderful seeing all the fantastic homework about Africa this week. It has really helped our new topic excite and enthuse the children.

In maths year 1 have looked at the order of number on a number line. They have focused on how as we count in ones the ones digit changes and as we count on in tens only the tens digit changes. In year 2 we have completed our multiplication and division work and the children have gained an excellent understanding of how the two operations are linked and use this confidently in their work.

Science is very exciting this term as we have planted our seeds and we are looking forward to seeing what happens next. Year 1 have discovered that one of our children appears to have 'green fingers' as her radish seeds already have shoots growing! We are looking forward to seeing what happens to the different seeds in the coming weeks.


Please can parents send their child/ children to school with a raincoat. The weather can still be very unpredictable and we try to be outdoors as much as possible.
