In Maths the children in Reception have been investigating how shapes fit together and create new shapes. In Year 1 the children have been working on numbers to 100 including how many tens or units in each number.

The class have enjoyed the story Giraffes Can Dance, which has stimulated a lot of comparison of other stories relating to Giraffes including how the Giraffe got such a long neck.

As part of our African project the children have looked at traditional clothes and jewellery that some of the people of Africa may wear. The children were keen to design some of their own necklaces.



They have also taken part in the National Stamp Competition, in which they were asked to design a stamp that reflects a hero during coronavirus. 



CLASS 2




