Class 1 have been busy with some great learning going on with our English work being inspired by The Little Red Hen. The children have been finding out how to make bread and using dough with a range of tools to mould and cut and shape it.

Year 1 have done really well with their part, part, whole models and Reception have been securing their recognition and ability to recognise amounts up to four without counting.

They have also had fun in PE with lots of throwing and catching activities. Many of the children were persistent in perfecting their skills.

Year 1 have been keen to write a range of words using their sounds, they are really starting to see their sound patterns in words which will make learning spellings easier. I am pleased with how the children in Reception are also learning their first sounds both recognising the sound and writing them.

If you hear singing about oat's and bans and barley growing it is our Harvest song, - can hear it in my sleep. Keep up all the hard work Class 1, we are very proud of you.

It has been a pleasure watching Class 2 immerse themselves in our new text 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne.

This week we have focused on the picture book 'The Tunnel by Anthony Browne'. The children have used their predication skills to create images of what could be through the other side of the tunnel. We have also developed our prediction skills by using the new vocab inferring using what we know through evidence to support our reasoning. The children were then able to create descriptive sentences, compare the characters and also discuss hidden fairy-tales creature in the authors illustrations.

Year 2 Mathematics work has been focused on consecutive numbers and what happens when we count, find one more and one less. We have particularly focused on the patterns as we create equations.

3+4=7

13+4=1**7**

23+4=27

33+4=3**7**

43+4=47 and so on




We are applying the number facts, 3+4=7 we learned in year 1 to help us solve higher number equations.

Year 1 children have been counting groups accurately and using the correct numeral to represent it. They have also been thinking about ordinal numbers, matching 1st with the word first, 2nd with second...


