The following deadlines apply this year:

- Applying for Reception Year school places to start in September 2022 (starting school for the first time) - closing date 15 January 2022
- Applying for Infant to Junior school (Year 2 into Year 3) places to start in September 2022 (current Year 2 pupils) - closing date 15 January 2022
- If a child has an Education, Health & Care Plan the closing date is 31st October 2021 for all applications.

Where is the time going?! We have had another fun week in class one.

CLASS 1

In reception we have been thinking about parts and wholes of different objects, animals and even ourselves!

In year 1 maths the children have consolidated their knowledge of a number line, putting numerals in the correct position, and comparing the numbers using the symbols for greater than, less than and equal to. They have now moved onto exploring numbers and understanding whether they are odd or even. They will use numicon and other resources to help with their understanding.

We started a new text this week called Vlad and the Great Fire of London. We have described Vlad the flea, explored the different colours used to convey fire, smoke and an explosion and made predictions as to what might happen next in the story.

We have been busy making salt dough bread, cakes and pastries for our very own Pudding Lane bakery role play corner. Luckily we are much better (and safer) bakers than they were in 1666!

### **STAR OF THE WEEK**

This week we have begun to explore what life was like in the 17<sup>th</sup> century, comparing similarities and differences of the city London. We have also looked at fire fighters in 1666 compared firefighters in the present day. To assess why we thought the Fire of London stared and how it spread so quickly.

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<u>Two</u> is made up of a pair; it is an <u>even</u> number.

three is **not** made up of pairs; it is an <u>odd number</u>.

In year 2 Maths we have completed our addition and subtraction unit and have started a new topic - Multiplication. We have focused on representing equal and unequal groups. The children have learnt that equal groups can be represented with a repeated addition expression and have identified the number of groups we have put the objects into to represent this. Now we are beginning to understand these can be represented through multiplication expressions which we will be exploring further next week.

We have 6 cubes altogether.

Firefighters in 1666 h

Each group is equal because there is an even number in each group.

I have split the cubes into three groups.

These can be represented as: 2+2+2 or  $2 \times 3$
