Next week we will be participating in the NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. online programme. This consists of an online assembly and supporting classroom-based activities. Speak out. Stay safe. is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline. Please see the letter attached for further details. We have used this resource in the past and feel it helps children develop the confidence and understanding to speak out if there is something worrying them.

Finally, the children have been talking about the weather this week and have made some little videos of themselves presenting the Weather forecast. Have a look at this link to check out the weather forecast for Church Aston.

Unfortunately we have had a child test positive in Class 2. As we have been together as a school public health have advised that all staff and children are counted as close contacts therefore they will all need to take LFD daily tests for the next 7 days.

Please note there has been a positive COVID-19 case within school.

We are taking all the measures we can in school to prevent transmission, while trying to provide a full curriculum of face-to-face learning.

In order to assist us in keeping everybody as safe as possible, while keeping the school operating, we ask that your child test using LFD (rapid) test kits daily for 7 days before coming to school each

As always, please ensure you are vigilant for symptoms and if your child does display symptoms, please keep them off school and book them a COVID test using this link: Get a free PCR test to check if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

As general advice, if your child is a household contact of a positive case (even at primary age) we would also ask that they take daily LFD tests for a period of 7 days from the date of exposure to the positive case.

The children dressed up in rich and poor costumes, set the table ready for dinner, and helped put out a fire in Stafford using a fire bucket. The children helped construct a wattle and daub wall and looked for the symbol to show us which pieces of wood slot together to hold the wattle and daub in place. Also watch out if you see an open window in a Tudor house the maid might just be throwing something horrible out the window! What could it be?

In English, the children are exploring powerful verbs in the story The Snow Dragon. They have


been capturing how Little Tuft *heaved* and *hauled* himself out of the deep, dark chasm.






