CLASS 1

Have a lovely weekend and we will see you next week.




STAR OF THE WEEK

There's an icy feel in the classroom this week!


The children have created wonderful paper collages of Antarctica. They have explored the texture of the paper and how they can manipulate it to create shapes and settings.






In English and geography this week the class have explored the continent Antarctica, its location and labelled a world map. The children learned facts about the continent and famous explorers that had visited there in the past and wrote statements to share what they had remembered. They have focused on Captain Scott's exploration.

In maths the year 2 group have consolidated their multiplication skills with doubling and have seen the link with halving.



The year 1 children have focused on their subtraction skills and their story telling using the sentence openers first, then and now.



Next week we will be making igloos with, and we need as many cardboard boxes and newspapers as we can gather, please check you recycling and send them into school on Monday. Thank you.




