
Thank you to Friends of School for organising the cake and uniform sale

### CLASS 1

#### CLASS 2

In English, Class 2 have been learning about Scott and the explorers of the Antarctic as part of our frozen world topic. Several of the children inhabited the role of the explorer from 1912 whilst being asked questions. As a cohort we then wrote a letter to a loved one similar to Scott's diary and then we tea stained the paper to give it an ageing affect.

Well done Class 2 for remembering all the facts over the past few weeks and sharing extra information on Scott!
