

My Recycling Bin Final Design

In English this week we have been reading The Tale of a Toothbrush and have been thinking about single use plastics and the damage they can cause to the environment. The children thought of different ways they could use their toothbrushes after they have finished using them to brush their teeth. They had some very interesting ideas including turning them into fishing rods, back scratchers and litter

pickers! Year ones used question marks and adjectives in their writing about Sammy the toothbrush.

In maths reception have been thinking of ways to make counting a group of objects easier. Moving the objects while counting them and putting them in a straight line were some of their ideas.

Year one are grouping in tens to count more efficiently. This makes it easier to count big numbers.

We have finalised our recycling bin designs in our DT lessons this week ready to start making them next week.
