The Reception children's luck with the weather continued on Wednesday for their trip to Forest School where they learnt all about different minibeasts! (As well as playing in the mud of course!)

Our focus book this week has been The Blue Giant by Katie Cottle. We used this book to help us think about how we can reduce the amount of plastics in the ocean. Year One children wrote letters to The Blue Giant apologising for humans polluting the ocean and they all made promises to help make the situation better.

In maths this week reception have been looking at what number 5 is made of. For example: '5 is made of 2 and 3, 2 and 3 makes 5.' Year One have been positioning numbers on a number line, focussing on multiples of 10.

We were inspired to make a giant piece of art after watching Katie Cottle talk about the art work in her book. We made the most of the sunshine again and made huge waves using paint, crayons and lots of plastic and card to collage. The end result is fantastic and really made the children think about their plastic waste.

Hopefully the nice weather continues into the weekend and we will see you on Monday for the last week of half term!
