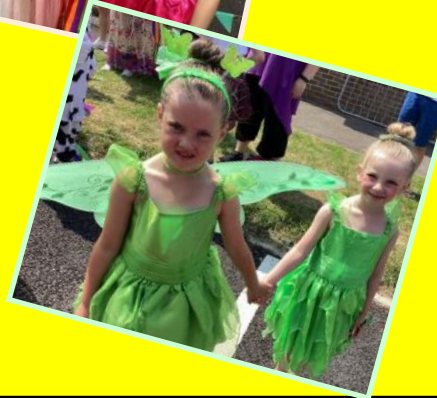

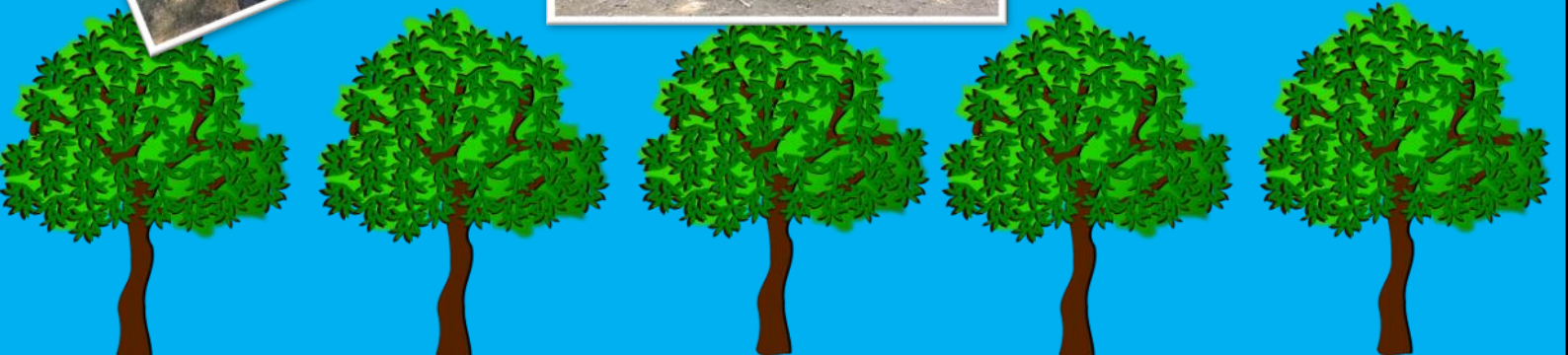




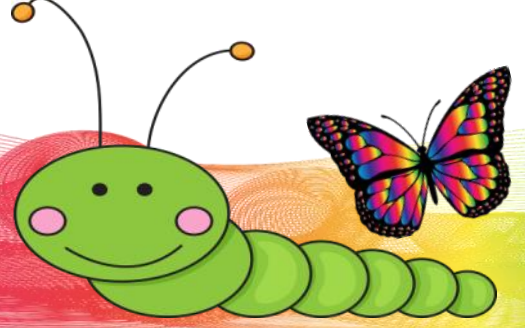
FOREST SCHOOL



The Next forest school will be for the Year 1 children on Wednesday 21st June.

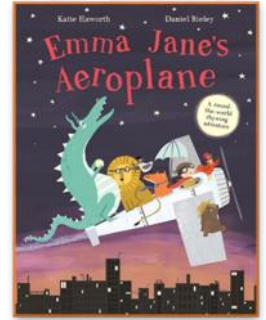

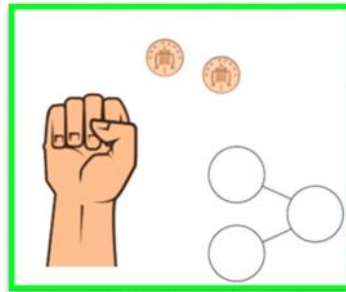
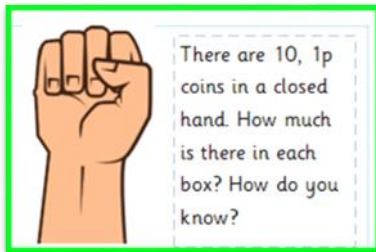
Phew, what a hot week we have had in class one! We have just about recovered from the excitement of the carnival on Saturday! It was fantastic to see so many of you all there!

The children are really taking off this week with their work on poetry. They have composed similes describing an eagle inspired by a poem written by Lord Alfred Tennyson. Here are some of their similes...

'Beak like a wolf's tooth pulling on his prey'



In maths, year 1 have been continuing to work on teen numbers and this week they have used money to problem solve.

There are 10, 1p coins in a closed hand. How much is there in each box? How do you know?

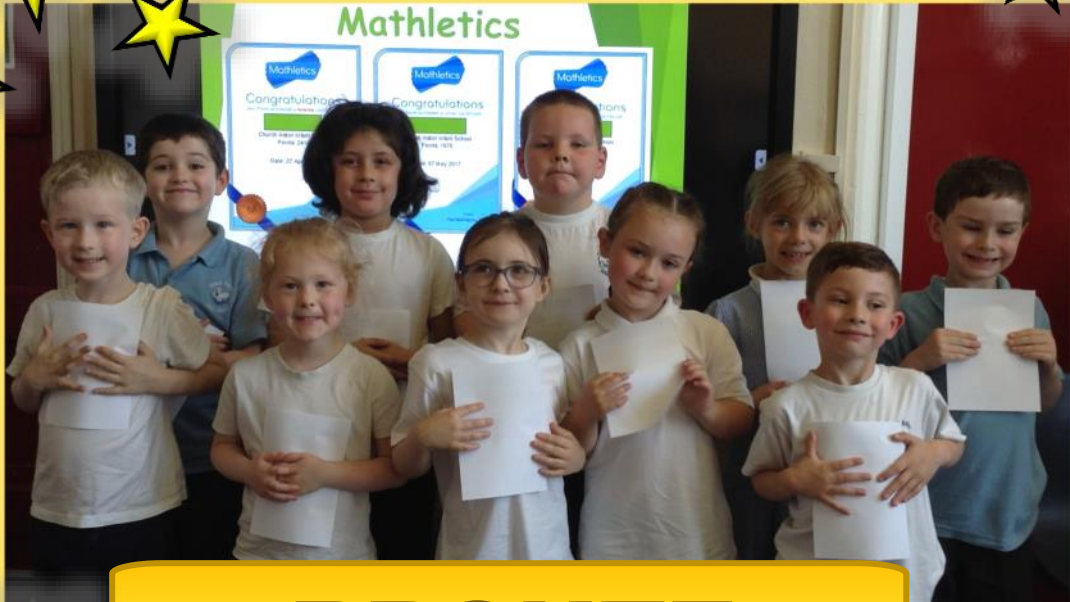
